## Yale-New Haven Hospital ENT and Medicine Unit

The 20-bed ENT and Medicine Unit delivers exceptional post-operative nursing care to the Ear, Nose and Throat patient populations. We also treat a general medicine patient population through the Hospitalist Service. Our professional nursing caregivers have a combined total of almost 200 years of experience, and enjoy the opportunity to work with some of the most renowned physicians in the field — including Dr. Clarence Sasaki and Dr. Douglas Ross.

From an ENT perspective, many of our patients are those who present some form of head and neck Cancer and require surgical intervention. Many are trached following their laryngectomy and neck dissection. Because of the nature of their disease, many of these patients will be readmitted over time, and as a result our staff often develop established relationships with both patients and their families. These patients and family members often require extensive teaching on airway management prior to discharge.

The Hospitalist patients present with general medical diagnoses, such as pneumonia, pancreatitis and CHF. The Hospitalist Service represents a model partnership with Yale-New Haven Hospital, the Yale University School of Medicine Department of Medicine and private physicians in the community.
